Book Club Discussion Questions for <u>The Stardust Grail</u>

- 1. What is the "right" way to preserve history? What is the "best" way? Are those two things the same?
- 2. How might the Earth be impacted culturally by First Contact? As one of the characters observes, "you can't live in the universe without leaving footprints." Is there ever a way for civilizations to meet that doesn't cause harm? Does it matter?
- 3. What responsibility do people have individually or as members for colonization and/or the negative impacts when people and cultures collide?
- 4. Is it possible to understand something wholly alien? Do you think there is anything universal about life?
- 5. Is it possible to truly love something or someone you don't understand? How can trust exist on such a foundation?
- 6. What do we owe other living things both members of our species and other people?
- 7. Do you agree with Maya's decisions? What about the other characters? What would you have done?
- 8. In the final sentence of the book, a new opportunity for exploration presents itself. What do you think is the right way to approach that opportunity, given everything that happened in the book?
